

# **ALL FOR PLAY AND PLAY FOR ALL**



Over the years, we have seen that the play spaces around us are shrinking. There is a dearth of time and space for children to come together and enjoy free play. As adults and as citizens, we feel that it is crucial to address this issue and create a movement to encourage citizens from all walks to come together to create play spaces and highlight the importance of play, which is essential for the mental and physical well-being of children and adults alike.

We have also seen that with the non-existing playgrounds in the neighborhood, the advent of smart devices, the changing social fabric with nuclear families and the ever demanding work life of parents; it's a continuous challenge to give attention to the child's as well as our own play needs. This November and every year, we gear ourselves for a mission - a mission that we think is very important to embark upon.

We, together with other play enthusiasts, initiate a campaign called 'Let's Play'. It is a campaign to entitle children to their natural avenues-play spaces and inspire adults who

have lost their childhood, to relive the child in them! Let's Play encourages individuals to make time for play, create a space for play and connect through play.

Every year, hundreds of volunteers (individuals and organizations) have supported the movement and taken it forward to thousands of children, the elderly, professionals, community helpers and people from all walks of life.

This brief report captures the success of the Let's Play 2019 campaign, which was initiated in November 2019.

## **HIGHLIGHTS OF LET'S PLAY 2019**

- ✓ The campaign kick started on November 7, 2019 and was extended till December 15, 2019.
- ✓ The play campaign reached out to over 5000 individuals across 40 locations in India, this year.
- ✓ Over 43 play hosts who are primarily college students, play facilitators and organisations, organised play events for different audiences such as children, the elderly, professionals, community helpers and people from all walks of life.
